ORAL EXPRESSION

ADVOCACY - WHY SHOULD WE ... ?

Thanks to this exercise of oral expression, students will have the opportunity to practise different lexical and grammatical elements while revealing a part of their personality and what is truly important to them.

This exercise is imagined to be done individually so that personal arguments would be developed. Obviously, it can be adapted for small groups of students sharing the same values. The task can be improvised though it may be useful for students to write a text first or a detailed plan of all the elements they want to deal with. You can also ask your students to make a video of themselves before showing it in class afterwards. If so, encourage them to imagine a specific accessory, a background music, ...

Depending on the level of your students, ask them to pay a particular attention to the structure of their speech using linkers, etc. Intonation and body language will of course be key factors too to convince their audience.

If you have already studied the modal auxiliaries in class, it could be an additional opportunity to practise.

The theme of the advocacy could be freely chosen by students. However, if they lack inspiration or if you would like to introduce or to further develop a specific topic studied in class, impose one.

CULTURE QUIZ- ANSWERS

Thanks to this quiz your students will have fun while learning about classic literary works as well as well cinematographic wonders.

1. Divide the class into groups and choose a captain for each team. To make it easier to run, don't have more than 5 groups.
2. Explain the guidelines:
You will go through different activities (video watching and reading exercises). Students have to remember as much information as they can. They could imagine a strategy, for example: A will take down notes about the dates, B about the places, C the name of the people mentioned etc. After each document students will have to answer questions. You can choose to give them the questions in a written document or ask them orally.
After conferring with their team members, the captain gives an answer to the teacher. He or she can blow a whistle, raise his/her hand, that's up to you!
The first team to give the correct answer wins a point.

CULTURE QUIZ- ANSWERS

Answers

1. This term, which literally means “bad place” in ancient Greek, depicts an imaginary society where citizens have lost their freedom, where injustice is the norm, where the authorities control every action and legislate on everything, ... It is the opposite of a “utopia” which refers to a perfect society.
2. As a psychologist, Bernard, an Alpha, should be happy but being smaller than the other Alphas, he doesn’t fit perfectly in his class and this makes him dissatisfied. This adds to his disapproval of the authorities’ methods of sleep-teaching and “drugging” the citizens with pills called “soma” which help people temporarily unhappy to be joyful again.

Here is a 4-minute long video which you might share with your students if you want to go deeper in the analysis of *Brave New World*. It proposes a summary of the plot as well as a short analysis which could lead to a debate. English subtitles are available.

Answers

1. He works as a clerk for the Ministry of Truth. His job is to update all texts, like books, newspapers, speeches etc. to match whatever the party deems as correct.
2. Julia is one of Winston’s colleagues. They engage into a forbidden romantic relationship. Both are opposed to the régime and hope to be part of a secret resistance organization, The Brotherhood. But they are arrested and tortured.
3. A government where a few powerful people make the rules for all.
4. Big Brother controls information, more specifically information about the past. It misinforms its citizens about current events, which is the constant war being fought overseas. Big Brother also controls time. The year 1984 is seemingly infinite. By controlling time, there is no past or memories but also no future or ambitions.
5. The Ministry of Truth represents the media which provides news, information, and entertainment.
6. The Ministry of Love represents culture conformity or social pressure to accept certain paradigms.

Answer

The Newspeak language consists of simplified grammatical structures and restricted vocabulary. This limits the freedom of thought which would threaten the ideology of the régime of Big Brother and the Party.
