The Legend

Rumbles - Makes a deep, continuous sound.

Faces as long as fiddles - Idiom meaning looking very sad or serious.

As elusive as the wind - Very hard to find or understand.

Pub - A bar.

Shepherd of the ships - Metaphor meaning person in charge of guiding ships.

Smuggler - Person who secretly moves goods illegally.

Rolled up to - Arrived somewhere, often casually or with confidence.

Get their hands on - Obtain or take something, often with effort.

Stick closely to - Follow or stay near someone.

The Spark

Coast is clear - No danger; safe to proceed.

Profiler - Someone who studies criminal behaviour to help investigations.

Clue - Piece of evidence that helps solve a mystery.

Fishing log - Official record of catches made by fishermen.

Poking around - Looking through things, often secretly.

Sea dog - Experienced sailor.

Wharf Dockside - Area.

Unfortunate accident - Bad event that happened by chance.

Strike - Refusal to work as protest.

Get into hot water - Get into trouble.

Go under the radar - Avoid being noticed.

Grudge - Long-lasting bad feeling towards someone.

Tough businesswoman - Strict and determined woman in business.

Head of the union - Leader of a workers' union.

Dockside gossip - Rumours told near the port.
