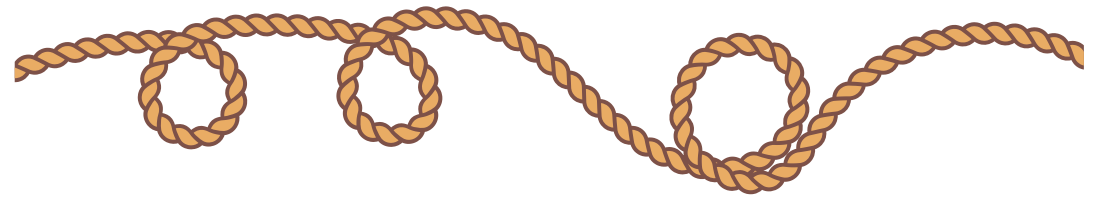

Back down: to stop opposing someone because of pressure or fear.

Ban: to officially say that something is not allowed.

Betray: to be disloyal to someone who trusts you.

Bookworm: a person who loves reading books.

Bribe: money or a gift given to make someone act dishonestly.

Bullet: a small piece of metal fired from a gun.

Campfire: a fire made outdoors, usually when camping.

Challenge: to invite someone to compete or fight against you.

Change takes time: real change usually happens slowly, not immediately.

Cheat: to act dishonestly to gain an advantage.

Citizen: a person who lives in or belongs to a town, country, or community.

Civic spirit: a desire to help and support your community.

Convince: to make someone believe something or agree to do something.

Corrupt: dishonest and using your power for your own benefit.

Deputy: a person who helps the sheriff.

Duel: a fight between two people, usually with guns.

Fill someone's shoes: to take someone's place and do their job successfully.

Forgive: to stop being angry with someone for something they did.

Freedom: the right to make your own choices.

Get away with: to do something wrong without being caught or punished.

Get rid of: to remove someone or something you do not want.

Give up: to stop trying.

Guilty: responsible for doing something wrong or illegal.

Gun: a weapon that fires bullets.

Justice: fair treatment according to the law.

Law: an official rule that people must obey.

Loyal: always supporting someone or something.

Make a difference: to have an important positive effect.

Make things right: to correct a mistake or fix a bad situation.

Mayor: the elected leader of a town or city.

Outlaw: a criminal, especially in stories about the Wild West.

Perform: to entertain an audience by acting, singing or dancing.

Pioneering: introducing new ideas or doing something in a new way.

Prove: to show that something is true.

Punish: to make someone face consequences for doing something wrong.

Reality check: an experience that makes you see a situation as it really is.

Refuse: to say that you will not do or accept something.

Revenge: hurting someone because they hurt you first.

Rights: freedoms and protections that people should have.

Rob: to steal money or valuable things from a person or place.

Robbery: the crime of stealing from a person/place, often using violence.

Saloon: a bar in a Wild West town.

Score settling: taking revenge for something that happened in the past.

Sheriff: the person who keeps law and order in a town.

Shoot: to fire a gun at someone or something.

Stubborn: unwilling to change your mind.

Talent show: an event where people perform to show their skills.

Thief / Crook: a thief steals things; a crook is a dishonest criminal.

Threat: something to show that you may hurt someone or cause a problem.

Traitor: a person who betrays their country, group or friends.

Trust: to believe that someone is honest and reliable.

Undertaker: a person whose job is to prepare dead bodies & arrange funerals.

Violence: the use of physical force to hurt someone.

Vote: to formally choose between people or options.

Wagon: a vehicle with four wheels, traditionally pulled by horses.

Watch your back: to be careful when someone may try to harm or trick you.

Wild West: Western United States, 1800s, famous for cowboys & frontier towns.

Witness: a person who sees something happen.

Words are mightier than the sword: ideas & words are stronger than violence.

Your money or your life: a threat by a bandit demanding someone's money
